Follow 1 mile down on the right. We share a common driveway (#113, 115, 117). From the street go about 500 feet, brown ranch near the end of the drive.

Your GPS will probably take you too far, so just **watch the mailbox numbers**. If you go through the S-turn you've gone too far. The picnic will begin around noon and we should start the business meeting around 1. Bring folding chairs, just in case. I have 10-12 chairs, last year we had 23 people in attendance.

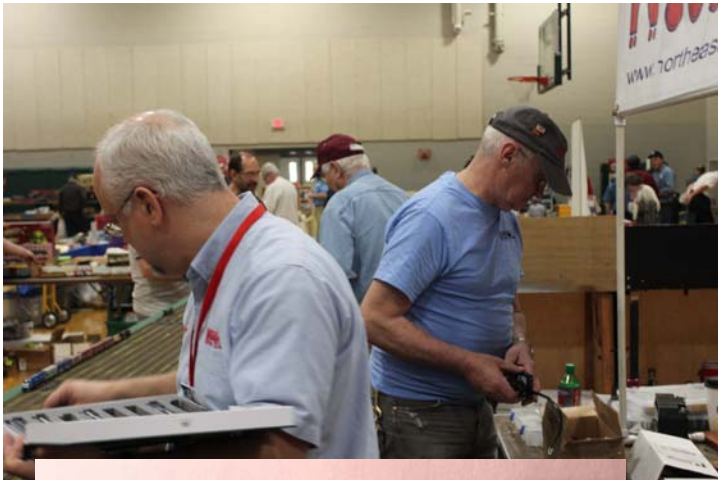

Brown	4.790"
Red	4.850"
Orange	4.910" (Standard Atlas section)
Yellow	4.970"
Green	5.030"
Blue	5.090"
Lt Blue	5.150"

Uncut 6-1/2" lengths of track used for the Atlas straight assortment are available from NTRAK. They are stiffer than flextrack and are used for connecting tracks longer than standard.
